TODD STAPLES TO VISIT GREENVILLE**
Statewide Official to Speak at Re-Election Event for Incumbent Flynn

Greenville – Texas Agriculture Commissioner Todd Staples will be in Greenville this Thursday evening, speaking at a dinner that is being held in support of State Representative Dan Flynn's Re-Election Campaign. Commissioner Staples is interested in meeting with the folks of House District 2, and discussing the current state of farming and agri-business in Northeast and all of Texas. Local farming families will be providing all the food for the event, with an emphasis on local, organic foods.

"Dan Flynn is a strong conservative who represents the values of voters' in House District 2. I have worked closely with Dan to preserve private property owners' rights, promote job creation, and protect Texas values. I look forward to that continued partnership and to visit with the leaders of Greenville and the surrounding areas."

Flynn is running for his fifth term as State Representative for House District 2, which includes Hunt, Rains, and Van Zandt Counties. His re-election efforts began early in December when he officially filed for his place on the ballot.

On the evening of Thursday, February 11, 2010, Flynn will welcome Commissioner Staples to Greenville at a dinner, held at the Fletcher-Warren Civic Center. The dinner is in support of Flynn's re-election efforts as well as features an informative discussion centered around the issues facing House District 2. Both Flynn and Staples will speak on the current and future state of the economy, rural life, and agriculture in Northeast Texas.

Commissioner Staples is running for re-election as the 11th Commissioner of Agriculture for Texas. Staples has focused on expanding and promoting the agency's successful GO TEXAN program that promotes the products, culture, and communities of Texas. He plans to continue further Texas' leadership role with agriculture in our nation, and to approach all issues with the same question: "How does this affect Texas families?"

Flynn believes his conservative view of government is very compatible with the residents of HD 2, and stated that he will "hold fast to pledge to uphold and enforce all laws and fight for the conservative principals of limited and less government, lower taxes, greater individual freedom, the protection of innocent lives and traditional family values."
