Representative Flynn Named to Leadership Post of National Conference of State Legislatures

WASHINGTON, D.C. - State Representative Dan Flynn has been named Co-Chair of the National Conference of State Legislatures' (NCSL) Budget and Revenues Committee. NCSL President Stephen Morris, Kansas Senate President, made the appointment.

"I am honored to represent the states' agenda in the continuing debate over the changing state-federal relationship," Representative Flynn said about his new appointment.

The Budget and Revenues Committee is one of the 12 standing committees of the National Conference of State Legislatures. The standing committees are responsible for developing policy directives that guide NCSL's states' agenda on Capitol Hill and within the administration. The directives stress: opposition to unfunded federal mandates, prevention of unnecessary preemption of state laws, protection of state revenue sources, and increased state flexibility in state-federal programs.

"Dan Flynn brings a great deal of knowledge and experience to the table," said Senator Stephen Morris. "I am pleased that he has accepted the appointment and I look forward to his valuable contributions to state public policy over the next year."

NCSL has just completed an active year in representing the interests of the states in Washington, D.C. including work on introduction of the Main Street Fairness Act, an extension of the Real ID Act deadline, and obtaining \$16 billion in federal assistance to help cover the cost of federal mandates in Medicaid.

Representative Flynn is a native Texan who serves House District 2 which includes Hunt, Rains, and Van Zandt Counties. He is currently serving on the House Committee on Defense & Veterans' Affairs as well as Homeland Security & Public Safety. He is chairman of the Texas Legislative Sportsman Caucus. He currently serves as member of the Deficit Reduction Task Force, member of the Military and Veterans Affairs Task Force, member of the International Relations Task Force, and now as the Co-Chair of the NCSL Budget and Revenues Committee.
